Noel will demonstrate a decorative 9" candlestick with
lots of beads, coves and OG's. Then will demonstrate
a type of weed pot that has a candle holder with a wax
cup under it rather than just a hole for the weeds.

Noel is a member of BWG, and one of the founders of
Low Country Woodturners serving Savannah and
surrounding areas. A retired banker, Noel took up woodturning
in 1990, and has taken numerous courses with well-known
turners.

President's Message - Sorry I wasn't in attendance last meeting to see

Don Duden's demo - had a student in the shop. August 5th meeting had 43 in attendance - 5 visitors.
Don started off his demo by passing around a
few of his bowls/platters for everyone to see how the rims were done. When
coming to the edge of a platter or bowl, "stop", and "think". Do I want to enhance this piece of wood
by taking the time to decide what edge would look good - or do I just want to get the sandpaper out and
sand the edges round. Don passed out a sheet of paper showing a few of the many types of edges that
can be turned. He then turned a 'fish tail' edge.

After a brief recess, Don then demonstrated how to do inlay. He passed around a board that
showed the different sizes of stones, and offered this tip - small stones for
small openings; big stones for large openings. When the opening or void in the vessel goes all the way
through, use painter's tape on the inside - this will prevent glue/epoxy from seeping into the insides (it
can be easily removed after the glue/epoxy/inlay has dried. Another tip offered, was to enhance the
turning by deciding on which voids to fill. To completely fill the entire turning w/stone, might be way
too much. Inlaying bronze in a few voids, and stone in some more, leaving a few voids empty - might
be the way for enhancing. NOTE: Please wear proper breathing equipment when sanding any type of
stone. Thanks Don - for an excellent demo.
